RENT & UTILITY ASSISTANCE

Do you need help with an overdue rent or utility bill?

The City of Tukwila has a program that may be

able to help with up to \$1200.

REQUIREMENTS

- Be a Tukwila resident
- Have lived in residence at least 3 months
- Rent must be past due
- Must owe less than \$2400
- Have a rental lease agreement
- Income is below 65% HUD guidelines

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

- \$1200 is the maximum amount a household can receive.
- Monthly assistance is available until funding runs out.
- Payments go directly to landlord or utility company.
- Utility assistance is NOT provided for phone, cable or internet.
- Calls and applications are processed in the order they are received.
